As before there is a site for **parents** with advice on supporting children's learning at home. Sometimes in a busy household it is easy to miss how much informal learning is linked to a child's formal learning.



You may notice your child's teacher using the words **Key Competencies**. These relate to the range of skills and abilities that help your learn child in today's world. These key competencies are:

- •Thinking
- •Using language, symbols, and texts
- Managing self
- •Relating to others
- Participating and contributing

Here are some suggestions from the Ministry of Education for everyday activities that include key competencies:

•Planning a meal - thinking; using language, symbols and texts, managing self

•Taking part in a powhiri at your marae - relating to others; participating and contributing, using language, symbols and texts

•Being in a sports team - participating and contributing; relating to others, managing self

•Mastering the rules of an online game - thinking; using language, symbols and texts.
